

Announcement from Du Yai Provincial Police Station

Regarding anti-bribery policy (Anti-Bribery Policy) and not accepting gifts or any other benefits.

(No Gift Policy) from performing duties Fiscal year 2025

According to the Organic Act on Prevention and Suppression of Corruption B.E. 2018, Section 128, paragraph one, prohibits any government official from receiving property or any other benefits. which may be calculated as income from anyone other than property or benefits that are appropriate according to laws, rules or regulations issued by virtue of provisions of law Except for receiving property or any other benefits in an ethical manner according to the criteria and amounts specified. The National Anti-Corruption Commission stipulates and the Police Code of Ethics 2021, Section 2(2), honesty and integrity Performing duties according to law formality of the Royal Thai Police with transparency and do not show behavior that is indicative of illegal exploitation. Be responsible for your human rights duties, be ready to receive inspections and be held accountable. Have a good conscience, consider society and item 2(4), think of public benefits more than personal benefits, have a public mind, cooperate, join together, and sacrifice in making benefits for the public. and create benefits and happiness for society, together with the national reform plan for prevention and suppression of corruption and misconduct (revised edition), specifying important reform activities. Activity 4: Develop the Thai bureaucracy to be transparent. No benefit. Goal 1, Section 1.1, have all government agencies declare that all government officials do not accept gifts and gifts. Type from performing duties (No Gift Policy)

Therefore, in order to prevent conflicts between personal interests and public interests (Conflict of Interest), accepting bribes, gifts, or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties, guidelines for anti-bribery have been established. (Anti-Bribery Policy) and not accepting

gifts, gratuities or any other benefits (No Gift Policy) from performing duties. The details are as follows:

Section 1 Objective

- 1.1 To prevent or reduce the opportunity to receive bribes. Conflicts of interest in various forms to police officers Under the jurisdiction of Du Yai Provincial Police Station
- 1.2 To encourage police officers under Du Yai Provincial Police Station to have awareness of refusing and accepting gifts and all kinds of favors in the performance of their duties.
- 1.3 To create an ethical and transparent organizational culture. (Organization of Integrity) of Du Yai Provincial Police Station to be strong and sustainable.

Section 2 Definition

"Commander" means a person who has the authority to command, supervise, monitor, and inspect police officers under his command.

"Police civil servant" means a police civil servant under the Du Yai Provincial Police Station.

"Bribe" means property or any other benefit given to a person to induce that person to act or not act in a position. Whether it is right or wrong according to duty

"Performing duties" means an act or performance of a government official in a position that has been appointed or assigned to perform a particular duty. or to act on behalf of the government in any duty, both general and specific, as a police officer whose powers and duties have been specified by law.

"Gifts, presents, or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties" means money, property, services, or any other benefits that have value and include tips. which government officials receive in addition to salary, income, and benefits from government service in normal cases and affects decision making approval permission or anything else in the

performance of duties in accordance with Characteristics that are beneficial in a dishonest way to the gift giver either in the past or while receiving or in the future.

Article 3 Scope of application

Announcement from Du Yai Provincial Police Station regarding anti-bribery policy (Anti-Bribery Policy) and not accepting gifts, gratuities or any other benefits (No Gift Policy) from performing duties. Fiscal year 2024, this edition shall apply to police officers under Du Yai Provincial Police Station.

Section 4: Guidelines for police officers

- 4.1 Do not ask for advice, give or accept bribes, gifts, gifts or any other benefits from performing duties.
- 4.2 Do not consent or connive with family members giving or receiving bribes, gifts, presents, or any other benefits to those involved in the performance of duties.
- 4.3 The performance of duties must adhere to the enforcement of the law with fairness. Hold on to the benefits and image of The police are important. Must not do anything which is a conflict between personal interests and public interests, such as accepting gifts or any other benefits that affect the performance of duties by using government or centralized resources for personal benefit. Disclosing inside information Compromising official time to do extra work, etc.
- 4.4 Reduce the giving or receiving of property or any other benefits in accordance with the principles and amounts specified. The National Anti-Corruption Office stipulates By using the method of expression by signing greeting cards, greeting books, condolence cards. or using social media instead of giving things
- 4.5 Do not tolerate, do not tolerate, or are indifferent to the behavior of accepting bribes, gifts, gifts, or any other benefits from Perform duties If any violations are found, please inform the inspector/station head immediately.

4.6 Commanders behave as a good example, controlling, supervising and supervising their subordinates to abide by. Duties according to this announcement

Article 5 Monitoring and inspection

The commander shall have the power and duty to supervise, monitor, and inspect the police officers under his command to conduct themselves. according to this announcement in the event that any action that violates this announcement is found, it must be reported to the inspector/station chief as soon as possible.

Article 6: Checking the facts

In the case of receiving a complaint/clues Personnel under the jurisdiction commit such offenses which will be dealt with at the police station. fact check According to the process of investigating the facts of corruption in the performance of duties. and report Progress will be reported to the complainant.

Article 7 Penalties

In the case where the facts were examined and it was found that the police officers had actually committed a crime. If it is a criminal offense, proceed with criminal prosecution. If it is a disciplinary offense, an investigation committee must be appointed according to the regulations. There will be punishment. Those who commit crimes strictly comply with relevant laws, rules and regulations. and forward matters according to the hierarchy of command.

Article 8 Complaint channels

Article 9: Measures to protect complainants, witnesses, and the accused.

9.1 Measures to protect complainants and witnesses

- When initially informed of corruption information shall be considered a government secret Conceal the name, surname, address or any other information that can identify the complainant and then conduct a secret investigation to see if there is truth. Or not?
- In cases where the facts are examined and it is found that the clues received are of great benefit to the agency. The complainant should have The right to receive appropriate benefits, such as favors or honorary awards.

9.2 Measures to protect the accused

- Accept and consider complaints only with names Location address or personal identification information of the complainant only. In cases where the complaint does not include the name, address, position, or personal identification information of the complainant, it will not be accepted for consideration unless evidence is clearly specified. as well as pointing out only definite witnesses
- In the case where the complaint has no basis in guilt End the matter and report it to your supervisor.
- In the case where the complaint is false to take disciplinary action or report to the complainant's supervisor carry out punishment or criminal prosecution if the accused wishes to
